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The Iceberg Assignment - Resit

Objectives: Thinking about & defining what your own cultural characteristics are. Communicating in English with a team of students. Presenting your findings creatively (in English).


Individvually or in teams

Step 2: Prepare a creative visual representation of your ideas. Make sure you can explain your ideas.

The Iceberg of Culture



Culture has been aptly compared to an iceberg. Just as an iceberg has a visible section above the waterline and a larger, invisible section below the water line, so culture has some aspects that are observable (explicit) and others that, although just as influential, cannot be directly seen (implicit). Also like an iceberg, the part of culture that is visible (observable behaviour) is only a small part while the unseen part is much larger.

For each item in the table below, discuss whether it is above or below the surface of the water. Make sure you understand why it is above or below.




If you look closely you may notice the relationship between the items which you have placed above the waterline and those you elected to place below.

In quite a few cases, the aspects that you have placed below the waterline tend to influence or cause the visible aspects.

Take the example of religious beliefs (= below / implicit culture). This particular aspect of culture is clearly visible in several way in our society (= above / explicit culture).




Preparation 2:
